Trams (Streetcars)


Trams connect the city center to Toyama Station and Iwase. The city tram is known locally as the *Shiden* and trams run every 5-15 minutes, making it easy for sightseeing around the downtown area. There are different types of cars in both classic and modern designs. One trolley has a low floor and is very modern-looking while another is retro-style with a wood interior.

Share Cycle "Avire" One-Day Pass

Public bike rental service is offered at 23 stations throughout the city center; bicycles can be rented from and returned to any of these stations. Please sign up at the Toyama Tourist Information Center or your hotel.

One-Day Pass for City Tram and Bus

This pass allows the holder to freely "hop on hop off" trams and buses around the city of Toyama for one day (within the ¥280 range from Toyama Sta.).

Sights To See

① Toyama Castle History Museum

Toyama Castle Park features reconstructed elements of the castle once home to the Maeda clan, the feudal lord of the Toyama Domain. The stone walls and moat provide a glimpse of the castle as it once was. A folk museum which is housed in the main tower features videos and reconstructions to explain the history of the castle.

② Toyama City Tourist Information Center

Located at Toyama Castle Park. Get information on sightseeing in the city. In addition, you can try activities such as putting on armor or a kimono, or riding and feeding a horse. The Toyama Castle Stamp is also available for purchase.

③ Toyama City Hall Observation Tower

The tower, rising 70 meters above the ground, is part of the city hall. It offers a panoramic view of the Tateyama Mountains, Toyama Bay, Toyama Castle, and the entire city. From April to October, visitors can enter until 21:00.

④ Matsu River Boat Cruise

A slow cruise will take visitors under seven bridges that span the Matsu River, a relic of the old Jinzu River. Visitors can enjoy a tunnel of cherry blossoms in the spring, greenery in summer, and the colors of foliage in the autumn.

⑤ Toyama Glass Art Museum

The art museum is located in a unique building known as TOYAMA KIRARI, designed by the well-known architect Kengo Kuma. Visitors can see innovative contemporary glass works here, including installation artwork by the American artist Dale Chihuly.

⑥ Ikedaya Yasubei Store

The preserved business location of a traditional medicine merchant. The shop sells the traditional digestive medicine *Etchu-hangontan*, other types of oriental medicines, herbal teas, and more. Also, you can try making your own pills!

⑦ Hie Shrine

This shrine has been worshipped as a guardian deity of the Toyama Domain. You can enter the shrine casually anytime as you walk around town. In early summer, visitors descend upon the shrine for the Sanno Festival.

⑧ Millet Art Gallery

This intimate art museum located on Chuo-dori, features the works of Jean-François Millet and other recognized master painters such as Gustave Courbet.

⑨ Daiwa Toyama (department store)

At the basement level you can buy souvenirs such as local specialties, famous confections, and local sake. Next door is the Grand Plaza event space.

⑩ Shusui Museum of Art

The museum features craftwork from medieval to modern times. The beauty of Japanese art and exquisite craftsmanship are on display with simplicity and grace.

⑪ Fugan Canal Park

This waterside park was created from a former boat harbor. The park features spacious lawns, Tenmon Bridge with two observatory towers, and a walkway along the water. Its stylish café is also hugely popular.

⑫ Canal Cruise-Fugan Suijo Line

A canal cruise that connects Canal Park to the port town of Iwase. At Nakajima Lockage along the way, visitors can see a "water elevator" in action that can reach 2.5 meters in water height difference.

⑬ Toyama Prefectural Museum of Art and Design


An art museum that brings together art and design. Many contemporary works of art from around the world are on display, including collections of posters and chairs. The rooftop garden is also popular for its unique playground equipment!

⑭ Mori 19th Century Residence Former Baba Family Residence

Both the Mori and Baba families were wealthy owners of merchant cargo vessels (*kitamae-bune*) and wholesalers of cargo vessels in the late Edo period. The buildings and interiors remain as they were in the mid-1800s at the height of business prosperity.

⑮ Iwase Canal Hall

A tourist facility located along the Iwase Canal. Visitors can buy Toyama-produced foods and other items and can enjoy a meal in view of the canal. Rental bicycles are also available.
