The Larger Toyama Core Partner City Region (Toyama Area) is home to the mysterious Toyama Bay, known for its firefly squid and broad velvet shrimp, as well as the Toyama Plain, which stretches out around the Bay, and the majestic peaks of the Tateyama Mountain Range.

From the sea, to the city center, to the mountain peaks—some rising as high as 3,000 meters—there are plenty of sights and activities in this pamphlet exist only in this area. This pamphlet shows the reader the fine sightseeing spots in this area (Toyama City, Namerikawa City, Funahashi Village, Kamiichi Town, Tateyama Town) broken down into the three categories of tradition, history and nature, and gives an overview of sightseeing packages in these three categories.



Toyama City

Core Partner City Spanning from the Sea to the Mountains
 Toyama has much to offer visitors: from the city center, the epitome of a compact city, and Iwase, the lasting legacy of an ancient Japanese shipping route, to the refined elegance of Yatsuo with its Owara Kaze no Bon festival, to Kureha, the home of the Glass City Toyama, to the outdoor adventures in the foothills of Mt. Tateyama.

Namerikawa City

City of Firefly Squid and Deep Sea Water
 Namerikawa City faces Toyama Bay and is famous for its bountiful firefly squid (hotaruika) catch. A number of attractions in the city allow the visitor to observe these delightful marine creatures, such as the Firefly Squid Boat Tour and the Hotaruika Museum. In addition, there is a place where you can purchase deep sea water from the bay.

Funahashi Village

The Smallest Village in Japan with Lotus and Cherry Blossoms
 In summer, lotus blossoms bloom in lotus fields at the gates of temples of this small village. There is also a row of cherry trees that stretch for a kilometer along the Kyonotsubo River, making this spot quite lively in spring with the blooming of the cherry blossoms.

Kamiichi Town

Home to Mt. Tsurugi, the Dream of Every Mountain Hiker
 Here visitors will find Mt. Tsurugi, which has been considered sacred since ancient times, as well as temples and parks situated in lush natural surroundings with holy water said to help cure all kinds of illnesses. There are also many opportunities to use this natural bounty to enjoy forest therapy and trekking.

Tateyama Town

A Key Tourist Spot on the Tateyama Alpine Route
 Among the more popular sightseeing locations for visitors from abroad are the impressive and dynamic huge walls of snow, Midagahara wetlands, listed in the Ramsar Convention, and Kurobe Dam, which served as a movie location.

What is the Larger Toyama Core Partner City Region?
 In January 2018, Toyama City signed a partnership agreement to form the Larger Toyama Core Partner City Region with the municipalities of Namerikawa City, Funahashi Village, Kamiichi Town, and Tateyama Town. This agreement forms a partnership between Toyama City and four surrounding municipalities to sustain the region's population and economy so that the area residents can live with more comfortably and with peace of mind as Japanese society faces an impending reduction in population, a declining birthrate, and increasing median age. This pamphlet will showcase lovely tour routes and hands-on programs that make use of the tourism resources of the Toyama Area to help promote long-stay tourism.




Traditional Experiences Package



Waterfall meditation at Oiwasan Nisseki-ji Temple



Package (2-day plan)



This course offers experiences especially characteristic of the Toyama Area, such as washing away your worries with waterfall meditation as well as creating your own keepsakes with glassblowing and pottery. Why not bring home a real piece of Japan?

1 Toyama Glass Studio



The Toyama Glass Studio, which is home to local artisanal glassmakers, offers glass blowing sessions and paper-weight making. Even beginners will feel comfortable trying glassblowing under the careful instructions of their artisanal glassmakers.

2 Keijusha (Japanese Traditional Paper Exhibit)



Etchu-Yatsuo Japanese paper is a durable, yet beautiful material that was formerly used to make medicine bags in Toyama. At the Keijusha studio, visitors will have the opportunity to make a one-of-a-kind sheet of Japanese paper using ancient paper-making techniques.

3 Oiwasan Nisseki-ji Temple



Waterfall meditation here is famous for the cold-water ascetic practices in the coldest days of winter and for the waterfall opening ceremony in the summer. Visitors can borrow white ceremonial robes at the temple to try waterfall meditation. Visitors may also calm their minds as they trace the image of Acala (Fudo Myo-o), a designated important cultural property of Japan.

4 Etchu Pottery Center Tonokan



Here visitors can experience Etchu Seto-yaki ceramics with Tateyama traditional techniques. Using either Etchu Seto clay, sourced from the Seto district where the techniques originated, or Shigaraki clay, visitors can make a dish, mug, or teacup.

5 Insect Kingdom Tateyama/ Tateyama Shizen Fureai Kan



At the Insect Kingdom Tateyama, visitors not only handle insects, they can even purchase them. There is also a farmers' market where local produce and specialty items can be purchased.

Here visitors can enjoy the process of cooking a special Toyama snack, shiroebi senbei rice crackers. After cooking the rice crackers over a brazier for around 15 minutes, the crackers are dipped in a vat of soy sauce to add the finishing touch. The taste of freshly cooked rice cracker is unbeatable.

Toyama Glass Art Museum



This museum serves as the launching point for the glass culture and art designed by the Japanese architect Kengo Kuma. Visitors will encounter the spatial art of the contemporary glass artist Dale Chihuly, as well as other numerous outstanding glass works from both Japan and abroad. Hikiyama Festival Float Center/ Yatsuo Owara Museum



The Float Center has three gorgeous Hikiyama (floats) on display from the Etchu-Yatsuo Hikiyama Festival, which is held on May 3rd every year. The Museum offers the chance to learn the history behind another amazing festival in the area, the Owara Kaze no Bon Festival.

Ganmokuzan Ryusen-ji Temple



This temple of the Soto Sect of Zen Buddhism was built in 1370, and is believed to have been established by a mountain god and a dragon god. The ancient Japanese hemlock trees (designated Natural Monument by the prefecture) lining the approach to the temple gates have become famous in recent years among those seeking "forest therapy."

Daikanbo Nature Park



Located at 325 m above sea level, the lookout spot in this park offers a magnificent panoramic view of the Uwadani Plateau and the Toyama Plain to the west with the Shiraiwa River and Joganji River and many other rivers snaking through the terrain before flowing into Toyama Bay.






Toyama Folk Museum

360° PANORAMA



Package (2-day plan)



The Tateyama Mountain Range—the very symbol of the Tateyama folk belief. This region is filled with places that transcend time and space, including museums that unlock the history of the area, a theme park that lets visitors experience the hell and paradise of Shinto and Buddhist lore, and the shipping agent houses that remain as the legacy of the prosperous ancient shipping routes. Explore the many stories of this region.

1 Toyama Folk Museum



This museum is housed within the tower of Toyama Castle. Visitors can learn of the 400-plus-year history of Toyama Castle through a variety of displays, including documents, models and videos. The 140 cm helmet said to have been worn by Toshinaga Maeda is also a must-see. (1-62 Honmaru, Toyama ☎076-432-7911)

2 Matsu River Boat Cruise



This sightseeing cruise passes under seven bridges that span the Matsukawa River, giving visitors wonderful scenery throughout the four seasons. The 500 cherry-blossom-tree tunnel in spring, the dazzling greenery of summer, and the blazing colors of autumn are certain to spellbind visitors at any time throughout the year. 3 Former Baba Family Residence



This residence was once owned by the Baba family whose patriarch was a successful trader ship proprietor in the shipping agency for Kitamae-bune ships during the 19th century. This house exhibits some distinctive features of the time, such as the 30 m-long earthen floor hallway and the huge 33 tatami-mat room. (107-2 Higashiwasemachi, Toyama ☎076-456-7815)

4 Muryo-ji Temple Takeuchi Tenjindo Ancient Tomb



Muryo-ji Temple, founded during the Kamakura period (1185-1333), is popular for the lotus blossoms best seen during the Obon period in early- to mid-August. Visitors can also see the 38.4 meter-long tomb, said to be built by a despotic king during the early Kofun period (300-538). 5 Nishida Museum of Art



This museum displays a wide variety of outstanding artworks from its collection, including pottery and porcelain works created in regions along the Silk Road, Buddhist images and Christian icons, as well as works of the mandala artist, Josaku Maeda. It also holds special or themed exhibitions, in addition to its regular displays. (1, Gokakizawa, Kamiichi-machi ☎076-472-4352)

6 Tateyama Museum of Toyama Mandala Yuen Park



This is a theme park that offers three-dimensional representations of the world of Tateyama Mandalas. It's comprised of four areas in total, including Chi-kai (hell), Hi-no-michi (path to Mt. Tateyama's peak), and Ten-kai (heaven). Anyone can experience hell, paradise, and re-birth. It's really stimulating! (93-1 Ashikuraji, Tateyama-machi ☎076-481-1216)

Toyama City Tourist Information Center



This information center, located within Toyama Castle Ruin Park, offers visitors interesting and unique opportunities, such as trying on a helmet or other items of battle dress, or even a full set of armor. They can also try horseback riding and feeding horses when there are events on. *Some attractions require reservations. (1-45 Honmaru, Toyama ☎076-439-0800 / Toyama City Tourism Association)

Shusui Museum of Art



This museum houses a collection, mainly focusing on paintings and crafts from the 12th century onwards. Its highlights include a National Important Cultural Property, The Satake Book of The Thirty-Six Immortal Poets by Shigeyuki Minamoto; works of prominent artists of modern Japanese painting; and swords made by swordmakers from Etchu Province. Nunobashi Bridge



Women were forbidden from climbing Mt. Tateyama during the Edo period (1603-1868), so the Nunobashi Kanjoe ceremony was held on Nunobashi Bridge serving as the border between this world and the next so that women could be reborn in the Buddhist paradise. This ceremony is listed with UNESCO Japan as a property for the future. (Ashikuraji, Tateyama-machi ☎076-462-1001 / Tateyama Town Tourism Association)

Tateyama Museum of Toyama Tenji-kan Hall



This museum researches and displays findings on the relationship between the humans and the natural surroundings of Tateyama, the home of the Tateyama folk religion of the past. This expansive premises contains a variety of facilities apart from the Tenji-kan Hall. (93-1 Ashikuraji, Tateyama-machi ☎076-481-1216)



This course covers an extensive area stretching from the sea to the mountains and presents a variety of attractions. These include thrilling mountain cart rides and a museum that explores the mysteries of Toyama Bay. Why not enjoy the bounty that nature has to offer?

1 Tateyama Mountain Carts



A popular activity that allows you to drive down a ski slope in the summer through a refreshing breeze. Have a thrilling experience while testing your steering and braking skills. (55 Hara, Toyama ☎076-482-1311/Oyama Kanko Kaihatsu Co.Ltd.)

2 Shomyo Falls



Sourced from the Tateyama mountain range, this four-tiered waterfall has the highest drop in Japan at 350 meters. The Hannoki Falls are also a sight to behold when they appear to the right of the main falls after the snow melt in the spring or a heavy rain. (Bunazaka, Ashikuraji, Tateyama-machi ☎076-462-1001 / Tateyama Town Tourism Association)

3 Toyama Bay Cruises



Visitors can enjoy a sightseeing cruise around Toyama Bay with views of the magnificent Tateyama Mountain Range, the tip of the Noto Peninsula, and Tateyama Kurobe Geopark. From the spring until early summer the firefly squid set nets are also visible. From late April to late November (410 Nakagawara, Namerikawa ☎076-476-9307 / Reservation telephone number)

4 HOTARUIKA Museum



This museum provides visitors with a fun learning experience about the ecosystem of deep sea creatures, especially the firefly squid. The very popular firefly squid show goes from late March until the end of May. (410 Nakagawara, Namerikawa ☎076-476-9300)

5 Fugan Canal Kansui Park



This park was created out of a former canal ship harbor. There are many options here for visitors seeking places to relax. For example, an observation deck that provides panoramic views of the Tateyama Mountain Range and the Tenmonkyo Bridge spanning the canal, what is said to be the most beautiful Starbucks in the world, and a stylish French restaurant. 6 Toyama Prefectural Museum of Art and Design



Visitors can enjoy art and design at this museum in a very relaxed environment that feels more like going to a park than an art museum. The Tateyama Mountain Range is visible from both inside the museum and from the Onomatopoeia Rooftop with its unique play structures. (3-20 Kibamachi, Toyama ☎076-431-2711)

Healthian-wood The Workshop



At The Workshop, essential oils and aromatic distilled water are extracted from the many herbs grown and harvested in its garden. Several programs, such as seminars and workshops using its products are offered, which allow visitors to focus on their own physical and mental health. (20-1, Nitchuuwano, Tateyama-machi)

Firefly squid sea tours



Visitors leave Namerikawa fishing port on a sightseeing craft before dawn to observe the firefly squid fishing with set nets. This is the only tour where visitors can observe the mysterious light emitted by the firefly squid. The tour period goes from late March until early May. (410 Nakagawara, Namerikawa ☎076-476-9300 / WAVE Namerikawa Co., Ltd.)

Anantan Sacred Site



After climbing down a number of stone steps, you will reach the hall where an image of Yakushinyorai (Bhaisajyaguru) stands with a natural water spring behind it. This water has long been believed nationwide as holy water that can help cure all kinds of illnesses. It has also been selected as one of Japan's 100 remarkable waters by the Ministry of the Environment. (84, Kurokawa, Kamiichi-machi ☎076-472-4711 /Anantan Koshinkai)

Fugan Suijo Line



This is a canal cruise that links the Fugan Canal Kansui Park with the port town of Iwase, and along the route, you can experience the "water elevator" at the Nakajima Komon gate. The canal uses a lock system to raise and lower the water level, lifting boats 2.5 meters above sea level at the canal's main elevation point. The cruise offers a rare opportunity to experience the dynamic water power used in this particular system. <https://fugan-suijo-line.jp>






